



The hollow heart of Medical Science

Why are neuroscientists, molecular biologists, geneticists, and developmental biologists,

oncologists so uneasy about their futures? These are men and women whose discoveries have



understand ourselves. The crisis in morale among today's medical scientists stems, not from money problems, the stage of development in their fields or the level of research being conducted, - but from their failure to form themselves into proper humane communities.

Low morale results from too little kindness and decency. At its roots, low morale is just a consequence of the indifference of the medical scientists, who allow the social and emotional foundations of their field to rot away beneath them. The vulnerability of the science that focuses on the human body and mind lies in the obligation that all scientists have to their systems with dispassion. Dispassion requires that the medical scientist ignore his or her own vulnerability of mind and body. The strain of trying to meet the impossible standards of cool curiosity about ones own fate imposes an unbearable distance between the scientist of the mind and body - and the body and mind of the scientist.

Under the strain, medical research scientists are susceptible that their instruments and procedures have somehow freed them from the limitations of their mind and bodies.

The conscious expression of this dream is an obsessive response to the certainty of biological death; the belief that a big enough win in the game of science will beat death itself by conferring a form of immortality on the winner.

Through today's biomedical science claims to search for repairs of nature's defects, too many practitioners behave as if their real purpose were only to gain the mythical immortality of being the first to make a certain discovery.

The problem is not that science and medicine wish to avoid finding cures. It is that they are too strongly motivated by an irrational, unconscious need to cure death, to be fully motivated by the lesser task of preventing and curing disease - to delay their patients' and their own inevitable ends. The irrational, obsessive promises made by scientists and physicians in the past few decades have, in a way, institutionalized the denial of death. But these promises are not sustainable. A humane version of the biomedical sciences would, for instance, acknowledge that they are not about to transcend the limits of the human body, and so they would no longer make promises that they cannot keep.



Such a change cannot happen unless scientists consider the consequences of their own behavior towards each other. We should begin by rediscovering and rededicating ourselves to the meaning of the title we professors hold. To 'profess' evolved from Middle English 'Profession' – to take vows. Professors do not deserve the title unless they are willing to give their time and effort to affirm something beyond their data. Affirmation and vows are matters of the heart.

To be a professor, it seems to me, one must have something of importance to oneself

that needs affirming and then one must affirm. Morale among professors in science will remain low until they decide that it is their strongest feeling, as well as their best data, that should determine professional behavior and status.

Proceedings Of Seminar on 25Th Feb 2006 on pediatric Coagulation Medicine

A seminar on pediatric coagulation medicine was organized by the hematology and transfusion Medicine division of the Children's hospital, Lahore in Collaboration with Pakistan society of Hematology, Lahore chapter on 25th Feb 2006. The program began with an inaugural address by Prof Tahir Masood Ahmad, Dean, The children's hospital & Institute of Child Health, Dr Nisar Ahmed, head of Haematology & Transfusion Medicine Department Children's Hospital, Prof

Abdul Hayee and Prof Yasmeen Lodhi, Prof of Haematology. Col Tahir Jameel being the moderator. Dr Samina Naeem (KEMC Lahore) delivered the first presentation focusing on coagulation disorders in the newborn, HIT & TTP. Brig Mohammad Ayyub Commandant Armed Forces Institute of Transfusion scabbard the audience by his ever interesting speeches. He spoke on pediatric thrombophilia highlighting maturely the inherited risk factors for venous thrombosis. The last talk of the first session was by Dr Asma Sadia (Resident, Children's Hospital, Lahore) on inherited platelet disorders in children, she charged her valuable experiences at Children's Hospital. There was a short tea break before the next session began.

Prof S M Haneef & Dr Fozia Butt chaired the second session & moderated by Dr Tahira Fayyaz. It started off with a very informative & impressive presentation by Dr Tahira Zafar (PIMS The Children's Hospital, Islamabad) on hemophilia. She emphasized on the urgent need for a comprehensive hemophilia care center in Pakistan.

Dr Mohammad Tariq of Shoukat Khanum Memorial Hospital Lahore gave the next presentation, discussing the recent advances on vW Disease.

The last speech was by Dr Shahla Tariq (President Hemophilia welfare Society Lahore) who being a hemophilic herself, gave a moving speech on psychological aspects of hemophilia and how we could help to reduce them by creating awareness, providing counseling and education. She also invited volunteer help for Pakistan hemophilia Welfare Society, Lahore chapter.

There was a short question & answer session at the end. The symposium was concluded by closing remarks by Prof Abdul Hayee followed by vote of thanks by Dr Nisar Ahmed to the chairman, guests



and all the participants of the seminar- Lunch was served afterwards.

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
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
